Lios An Rú & 19th century deserted villages around Ballyvaughan

A team of Irish and US archaeologists have started work at a deserted village at Lios an Rú, on the farm of JJ Keane, on the hill above Newtown castle in Ballyvaughan, as part of a major multi-annual project to investigate the lives and work of women, children and men in the Burren before and after the Famine. The archaeologists include US Professor Charles Orser, an esteemed expert on this period, as well as archaeologists from NUI Galway including Dr. Maggie Ronayne. The project will have a number of elements including research, education and community archaeology and the researchers would love to hear from people with stories from these deserted villages. Burren bumblebee blitz The Burren is hotspot for bumblebee species in Ireland, and is a key location for some of our rarest species. The Shrill Carder bee and the Great Yellow bumblebee are both threatened with extinction from Ireland, but still exist in small numbers in the Burren. The National Biodiversity Data Centre is carrying out a Bumblebee Blitz to survey how many bumblebee species exist in the Burren, how widespread they are across the region, and exactly how many populations of the very rare species remain?
