

COMMON DOLPHIN

Deilf choiteann

Delphinus delphis

Widely distributed in British and Irish waters the Common Dolphin is usually found in groups of 10-30. They are fast swimmers, reaching speeds of 24km per hour or faster if threatened.

Description: The distinctive yellowish hourglass pattern on their sides makes them easy to identify. Common dolphins measure up to 2.4 metres.

Habitat: Common dolphins are inquisitive and sociable, often approaching boats and hitching a free ride in the wake caused by the boat, an activity known as 'bow-riding'. To the delight of the passengers, they will often travel alongside a boat for several miles.

Diet: The common dolphin has between 80-120 sharp pointed teeth on each jaw and eats a varied diet of squid and fish, such as cod, herring, and mackerel.

Tá an Deilf Choiteann le fáil go forleathan i bhfarraigí na hÉireann agus na Breataine agus is iondúil go mbfónn idir dheich agus tríocha díobh i dteannta a chéile. Snámhóirí tampaidh iad a shroicéann luais 24 ciliméadar in aghaidh na huairé nó níos tapúla i gcás go mbagraitear orthu.

Cur síos: Is furasta aithinte iad ón bpátrún buí orláiste ar a dtaoibh. Tá na deilfeanna coiteanna 2,4 méadar ar fhad.

Gnáthóg: Tá na deilfeanna coiteanna fiosrach agus caidriúil agus is minic iad ag druidim le báid ag lorg síbe sa mharrbhshruth, eachtra a dtugtar bogharéim uirthi. Cúis mhór rímeíde do na paisinéirí go dtaistleoideadh siad go minic taobh leis an mbád ar feadh roinnt mílte.

Cothú: Tá idir 80-120 facal bhiorach ghéar ar gach gíall ag an deilf choiteann agus itheann sí bia ilchineálach mar scuid agus iasc, leithéidí troisc, scadáin agus ronnaigh.
